Inpatient Care

We have two Hospice Houses available to serve patients and families. The Ohio's Hospice of Dayton Hospice House is located at 324 Wilmington Avenue. Lorelei's Place Hospice House, serving Ohio's Hospice of Butler & Warren counties, is located in Franklin.

Hospice Care at Home

We work with family members and family physicians to offer the highest quality of personal care in the privacy of a patient's home. We support family members and caregivers with a professional care team of physicians, nurses, advanced practice nurse specialists, respiratory therapists, home health aides, social workers, pharmacists, grief counselors, chaplains and volunteers.

Nursing Home/Assisted Living Care

We partner with extended care and assisted living facilities to ensure that superior end-of-life hospice care is available in each patient setting. Our care is personalized to meet individual needs and provide peace of mind.



Ohio's Hospice of Dayton is the first hospice in the nation to earn Pathway to Excellence® designation.

Ohio's Hospice of Dayton President and CEO Kent Anderson celebrated the announcement saying, "I am so immensely proud of our nursing teams in achieving this wonderful distinction and accreditation. In my 20 plus years in healthcare this is by far the most talented team of nurses and nursing leadership with which I have had the privilege to serve."

The American Nurses Credentialing Center's (ANCC) Pathway to Excellence Program is an organizational credential to recognize healthcare facilities that have created positive work environments where nurses can thrive.

Greg Toman, board chair for Ohio's Hospice of Dayton, said, "I am proud to be part of an organization that continually strives for excellence. Achieving the Pathway to Excellence accreditation reflects the commitment to our mission by our nursing team. Being the first hospice in the country to achieve this status reflects Ohio's Hospice of Dayton's national leadership in hospice care."

Pathway-designated organizations participate in a rigorous review process that determines organizational commitment to nursing excellence. Nurses in the organization verify the organization meets the high Pathway to Excellence standards by participating in a completely confidential online survey.

Those achieving designation are deemed to be among the best places for nurses to work, with high nurse satisfaction and retention. Research shows that healthy work environments improve not only nurse satisfaction but also patient satisfaction and quality of patient care.



Innovative Care Solutions

Patients with serious illnesses have a new source for support with the opening of the Innovative Care Solutions Center for Supportive Care.

Innovative Care Solutions is a service of Ohio's Hospice of Dayton and a part of the continuum of care provided to patients with serious illnesses.

Innovative Care Solutions is also the Dayton area's most experienced palliative care service, and has been offering patients care for over a decade. With the opening of a new Center at 8087 Washington Village Drive, Suite 120 in Dayton, Innovative Care Solutions is further extending access to patient services.

Palliative care is designed to address the needs of patients with serious and chronic illnesses. Staff members including board-certified specialists work together to improve quality of life and to stabilize and strengthen patients. The Innovative Care Solutions team includes doctors, nurses, social workers, counselors and others specially trained in supporting patients with serious illness. Services include:

- addressing symptom management needs such as pain, shortness of breath, fatigue, constipation, nausea, difficulty sleeping and loss of appetite
- counseling and assistance dealing with anxiety, depression and other emotions

• guidance in accessing community services and resources

Services are tailored to the needs of patients with advanced cancer, heart, lung or neurological illnesses that affect activities of daily living and quality of life. Patient consults and services are available in the new Center.

Beyond Our Border

Ohio's Hospice of Dayton is working with the Foundation to Assist Cancer Patients in Cuenca (FASEC), located in Ecuador. FASEC is a non-profit organization that provides free or low-cost services to cancer patients and their families.

Founded in 1981, FASEC helps hundreds each year, many of whom are unable to pay full price for services. The center can accommodate up to 34 patients, providing nursing and counseling services. FASEC is located next door to SOLCA, the Society to Combat Cancer, one of Ecuador's three major cancer treatment centers. Besides assisting patients recovering from or undergoing cancer therapy, FASEC also provides hospice services for the terminally ill.

Many of the people served live outside of the city of Cuenca, including some as distant as the jungle. Often they have no place to stay when they are receiving treatment. Before FASEC was established, many poor patients were sleeping in doorways outside of the hospital.

FASEC is a labor of love for the administrators, members of the board of directors and volunteers. Resources are limited and the organization relies entirely on donations. FASEC's long-term objectives include expanding services to all patients in need, not just those affected by cancer, and expanding end-of-



life services. That's where the partnership with Ohio's Hospice of Dayton comes in.

Staff members apply to participate and, when selected, travel to Ecuador to offer educational support and demonstrations in medical care. The program also facilitates the donation of medical equipment and supplies to FASEC. The partnership has resulted in exchange visits by clinicians from Ohio to Cuenca, and vice-versa.

Every visit is aimed at strengthening the capabilities of the FASEC's endeavors to address the end-of-life needs of patients and families in Cuenca.

Nursing Honor Guard

Ohio's Hospice of Dayton established the Nursing Honor Guard to celebrate and honor those who have dedicated their professional lives to nursing. The Nursing Honor Guard is comprised of volunteer nurses who conduct a ceremony at the patient bedside. Dressed in traditional and historical uniforms, the Honor Guard recognizes the nurse for her commitment to caring and providing compassion to patients.


