Providing Superior Care and Superior Services Through Complementary Therapies

At Ohio's Hospice of Dayton, we offer innovative care and services beyond what is required by Medicare or Medicaid. Quality care for hospice patients controls pain, anxiety and agitation. We have introduced an array of complementary treatments that have been proven to improve clinical outcomes for patients while reducing the need for medications. All of these complementary services are supported through donor dollars. They include:

Starlight Therapy[®]: One of the more unique therapies available from Ohio's Hospice of Dayton is Starlight Therapy, which has a 90% rate of effectiveness in helping patients find relief from agitation, anxiety and restlessness within 30 minutes. The use of a star projector to shine pinpoints of light that move like the stars helps patients achieve greater relaxation, reducing the need for medication.

Massage Therapy: Massage therapy can supplement and help decrease the side effects of various pain medications. Patients asked to rate pain and anxiety before and after massage therapy showed significant improvement in levels of anxiety, pain and peacefulness. Research has also shown benefits not only in reduced physical distress but in emotional distress as well.

Music Therapy: Music can be a powerful tool to effectively address the physical, emotional, cognitive, and social needs of hospice patients. Qualified music therapists provide opportunities for creating, singing, moving to and/or listening to music. Music also can be useful in physical rehabilitation by facilitating movement, increasing motivation, and providing emotional support for patients and their families. It encourages reminiscence and provides an outlet for the expression of feelings.

Aromatherapy: Increasing research supports the effectiveness of aromatherapy in relieving anxiety, stress, and related symptoms such as hypertension, depression and insomnia. Volunteers and personal care specialists are trained in the use of aromatherapy with patients as an adjunct approach for care and comfort.

Ohio's Hospice of Dayton is honored and privileged to offer these complementary services to our patients. We are grateful for the generous donations from members of the community. The Memorial Courtyard features a waterfall and beautiful granite stones with engraved name plaques available to honor your loved ones. It is our privilege to help provide ways to remember and memorialize those we love.

Large Plaque – 8"x5" - \$1,500

Six lines/65-100 characters/spaces/portrait available

Medium Plaque – 6"x3.5" - \$550

Four lines/45-65 characters/spaces/emblem available

Small Plaque – 4"x2" - \$275

Three lines/40 characters/spaces
